The ambassador Eunice mothapo gave words of encouragement to those who are living with the virus and those who are looking after them. Apparently she's also HIV reactive and speaks from experience "the virus does not keep me alive I keep it alive" she said. She lived with this virus over 10 years luckily she was never sick. She's now providing the counseling to the local clinics and educates people about HIV/AIDS. She advised them to get tested and those who are reactive to stop being in denial to start accepting their status and take their medication. "Going public about my status wasn't easy but it made me to find closure and accept myself" she said. It helped lots of people to come forward and start taking their medication. After her speech the Ambassador, lots of people gueued to get her contact details. The event was characterized by the local dancers and poem.
