Over the past six (6) years, Molemole Local Municipality has maintained an unqualified audit opinion which has in return scored us three (3) awards at the Municipal awards held at Meropa Casino on 28th September 2021.

Various projects under Local Economic Development and Planning are 100% completed, namely: the newly built satellite office at Phaudi village in Moletji, phase three (3) of the Capricorn Park internal streets from gravel to surface, the fifteen thousand (1500) Seater Grandstand and Ancillary work at Mohodi Sports Complex "The municipality is working very hard to bring efficient and sustainable service delivery to

our communities", says Mr Mosena, Municipal manager who led the municipality in ensuring sound and sustainable financial management and setting best practices.
